Through these proceedings, the Petitioners seek enforcement of certain

contractual obligations. Per counsel, since Petitioner's liability has already been

determined, as such, petition in hand is maintainable. However, during course of

arguments, when counsel was confronted with the prayer clause, whereby,

Petitioner is seeking direction for appointment of an auditor by Respondents, to

verify the accounts/bills and to pay off the liabilities of the Petitioner, he replied

that in order to avoid the highhandedness of NAB or any other antigraft agencies,

the Respondents are reluctant to do the needful as such finding no alternate and

efficacious remedy the Petitioner has knocked the door of this Court.

We have heard the learned counsel for the Petitioner and also scanned the

record which consists of more than thousand pages. Admittedly, the liability, if

any, is an outcome of a contractual obligation which cannot be enforced through a

writ petition.

In view of above, petition stands dismissed. However, for redressal of

their grievance the Petitioners may approach the proper forum, if so advised,

subject to law.
