Learned Assistant Advocate General, Sindh, files statements on behalf of official respondents No.2 to 4, which are taken on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner had allegedly borrowed an amount of Rs.250,000/- from respondent No.5, namely Partab Mal, and according to him, the said amount has already been repaid. He further submits that, at the behest of respondent No.5, the police officials are causing harassment to the petitioner. The official respondents, in their statements, have categorically denied the said allegations.

Learned Assistant Advocate General and learned Deputy Prosecutor General, Sindh, submit that the official respondents shall act strictly in accordance with law. They further submit that neither have the official respondents harassed the petitioner nor do they intend to do so, and that any action, if required, shall be taken strictly in accordance with law.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, after going through the statements filed on behalf of the official respondents and hearing the submissions of learned law officers, states that he would be satisfied if the official respondents are directed to act in accordance with law and not to harass the petitioner.

In view of the above statements and submissions, this petition is disposed of with the direction that the official respondents shall act strictly in accordance with law and shall not cause any harassment to the

petitioner. Needless to observe that if any proceedings are initiated, the same shall be conducted strictly in accordance with law.

It is further clarified that any civil dispute arising out of the alleged transaction between the petitioner and respondent No.5 shall be resolved independently by the competent Court of law, without being influenced by any observation made herein.

The petitioner shall, however, be at liberty to avail any other remedy available under the law, if so advised.

Let a copy of this order be transmitted to the learned Advocate General, Sindh, as well as to the official respondents concerned, for information.
