ORDER

Khalid Hussain Shahani, J:- At the very outset, learned counsel for the applicant, on instructions, submits that he does not wish to press the instant Criminal Miscellaneous Application, provided that a direction is issued to the learned Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate-II, Tando Adam, for expeditious disposal of an application (Annexure "G"), whereby a prayer has been made for issuance of appropriate directions to the Investigating Officer to conduct further investigation in Crime No. 10 of 2026, registered under sections 380, 457, and 34, Pakistan Penal Code, at Police Station Beerani, District Sanghar.

2. Learned Deputy Prosecutor General, appearing for the State, has candidly stated that he has no objection to the course proposed by the learned counsel for the applicant.

3. In view of the statement so made at the bar and the no-objection recorded on behalf of the State, this Court is persuaded to dispose of the instant Criminal Miscellaneous Application as not pressed. However, in order to ensure that the administration of criminal justice is not impeded by avoidable delay, and that the statutory framework governing further investigation is meaningfully adhered to,

it is deemed appropriate to issue necessary directions to the Court of competent jurisdiction.

4. Consequently, the learned Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate-II, Tando Adam, is directed to decide the application (Annexure "G") strictly in accordance with law, expeditiously, and preferably within a period of thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of this order, after affording a fair and reasonable opportunity of hearing to all concerned parties.
