ORDER

Adnan-ul-Karim Memon, J. Petitioner Mst. Samina Mai has filed this Constitutional Petition under Article 199 of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973, seeking following relief: -

- a. *Direct the NADRA to remove of the CNIC No.31301-5257396-8 of the Petitioner available on the NADRA Record on the basis of Form ‘B’ as the Petitioner is validly CNIC holder bearing No.31301-9159044-0.*
- b. *Direct the Respondents to decide/resolve the issue for removal of CNIC No.31301-5257396-8 within specific time frame.*
- c. *Grant any other relief that this Honorable Court deem fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.*

2. The subject petition has been filed with non-compliance of Sections 79 and 80 of CPC, without impleading the necessary parties as that objection has been raised.

3. It appears that this Court has been informed that Mst. Samina Mai has multiple CNICs. The report submitted on behalf of NADRA shows that the Petitioner is showing as DUP CNIC holder i.e. CNIC and CRC, therefore, the Petitioner is advised to visit nearest NADRA Centre along with supporting documents for DUP clearance/cancellation of CNIC through NFC module.

4. When confronted with the above position, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks disposal of the instant petition with the understanding that the Petitioner shall approach nearest NADRA Centre along with supporting documents for DUP clearance/cancellation of CNIC through NFC module. It is, however, observed that the aforesaid exercise shall be completed within a period of two weeks.

5. In view of the above, without touching the merits of the case and with consent of the parties, the petition is disposed of in the above terms.
