ORDER

RIAZAT ALI SAHAR, J.- Through this Criminal Revision Application, the applicant has challenged the impugned judgment dated 09.12.2024 passed in Criminal Appeal No.07/2024 by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Matiari, whereby maintaining the judgment dated 31.08.2024, passed by learned Civil Judge & Judicial Magistrate-I, Matiari in Criminal Case No.12 of 2017, in crime No.09/2017 registered at PS Matiari for the offences punishable under sections 489-F, 506/2, 34 PPC, whereby the applicant Bahadur Khan was convicted and sentenced as Simple imprisonment for period of two years and fine Rs.40,000/- for the offence under section 489-F PPC and in case of default of payment of fine amount, he shall further undergo two months S.I. However, benefit of section 382-B Cr.P.C. was extended to the applicant.

2. During pendency of instant criminal revision the parties have patched up and filed application in terms of Section 345 (2) Cr.P.C. with prayer to allow the parties to compound the offence and application in terms of Section 345 (6) Cr.P.C. with prayer to acquit the applicant. The applications are supported with the affidavit complainant Muhammad Ismail supported through NADRA verification. Office to assign numbers on the said applications.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant states that on the intervention of nekwards and accused has taken oath of holy Quran, the complainant has patched up his differences, pardoned the applicant and do not want to proceed the matter further and has also no objection for acquittal of the applicant.

4. Complainant Muhammad Ismail is present in person states that he has patched up his differences with the applicant as the applicant has taken oath on holy Quran, therefore, he has no objection, if the applicant is acquitted of the charge. Complainant admitted the contents of compromise applications and his signatures to be true and correct.

5. On the other hand, learned Deputy Prosecutor General Sindh as well as learned counsel for the complainant have no objection for acquittal of applicant in view of no objection raised by the complainant.

6. Since the complainant has pardoned the applicant and raised no objection in favour of applicant for his acquittal as well as there is no objection on behalf of learned D.P.G. Sindh and learned counsel for the complainant and offence is compoundable, therefore, impugned judgment dated 09.12.2024 passed by the learned appellate Court/Additional Sessions Judge, Matiari and judgment dated 31.08.2024, passed by learned Civil Judge & Judicial Magistrate-I, Matiari are **set-aside**. The applicant namely Bahadur Khan is acquitted of the charge. He is present on bail. His bail bonds stand cancelled and surety discharged. The office shall return all surety papers to the surety after proper verification and identification as per rules.

7. Instant Criminal Revision Application stands **disposed of**.
