

The record further reflects that the petitioner has not approached any competent authority or police functionary regarding the alleged acts of harassment. Therefore, before invoking the extraordinary constitutional jurisdiction of this Court, the petitioner is required to avail the remedy provided under the law. In the absence of any exceptional circumstance warranting direct interference by this Court, the instant petition is not maintainable.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, as well as the dictum laid down by the Honourable Division Bench of this Court in *Abdul Hameed and another v. Province of Sindh and others* (PLD 2019 Sindh 168), and the judgment passed by this Court in C.P. No. S-482 of 2025 (*Manzoor Ali v. Province of Sindh and others*), wherein it has been held that constitutional petitions seeking protection and restraint against harassment are not maintainable where an alternate remedy is available, it is observed that the petitioner has an adequate remedy before the learned Justice of Peace and other competent forums. Consequently, the instant petition is not maintainable and is hereby dismissed in limine, along with the listed application(s).
