The record reflects that on the previous dates of hearing, i.e., 12.05.2026 and 25.05.2026, no one appeared on behalf of the petitioner. Today as well, neither the petitioner nor his learned counsel is present before the Court.

The instant petition pertains to the grievance of alleged harassment and seeks protection. A perusal of the record further reveals that the petitioner had already approached the learned Justice of Peace through Criminal Miscellaneous Application No.128 of 2026, wherein an order granting protection was passed in his favour.

It is pertinent to observe that this Court, while exercising constitutional jurisdiction under Article 199 of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973, is not an executing forum for implementation of orders passed by the learned Justice of Peace. In case of any non-compliance or excess on the part of the concerned functionaries, the petitioner has an adequate and efficacious remedy available before the same forum under the provisions of Section 22-A(6)(iii), Cr.P.C.

Since the petitioner has already availed the statutory remedy and obtained an order of protection from the competent forum, any grievance regarding its implementation is required to be agitated before the said forum. Where an alternate remedy is available and has already been invoked by the petitioner, recourse to the constitutional jurisdiction of this Court is unwarranted.

Accordingly, the instant petition is misconceived and not maintainable. The same is, therefore, dismissed along with the listed application(s), if any.
