Muhammad Ali Mazhar, J: The petitioners have approached this Court for regularization of their services as, according to them, after promulgation of the Sindh (Regularization of Adhoc & Contract Employees) Act, 2013, they are entitled for the equal treatment, but despite their various approaches, their cases have not been considered for regularization, while they were performing their duties on contract basis. The learned counsel for the petitioners further argued that during pendency of this petition, the services of petitioner No.2 have been terminated in the month of August, 2015, and since April, 2015, the salaries of the petitioners have not been paid. Mr. Ali Asadullah Bullo, Advocate, is appearing for the respondents No.2 and 3, who at the very outset made a categorical statement that the respondents No.2 and 3 have already constituted a Scrutiny Committee for considering the cases of contractual employees and on instructions he undertakes that the

cases of the petitioners will also be referred to the Scrutiny Committee for evaluation of their academic qualification and fitness. So far as the termination of petitioner No.2 is concerned, he submits that Scrutiny Committee has already been constituted and it is a fact that the services of the petitioner No.2 were terminated during pendency of this petition, therefore, his case will also be referred to the Scrutiny Committee for considering his case. It is further stated by the learned counsel that so far as the question of unpaid salaries is concerned, the matter will be examined by the competent authority and if the salaries are found unpaid, the up-to-date payment of salaries will also be made.

2. On this firm statement, the learned counsel for the petitioners is satisfied. Petitioners are also present in Court and they also agree to this proposal.

3. In view of the above, this petition is disposed of. The respondents No.2 and 3 both are directed to immediately refer to the cases of the petitioners to the Scrutiny Committee and decide the matter within the period of forty five (45) days. Pending applications are also disposed of. Copy of this order may be transmitted to Mr. Ali Asadullah Bullo, Advocate for compliance.
