Petitioner is real daughter of deceased Farzana Hussain, who died on 7th October, 2006 in Critical Care Unit, the London Clinic, Marylebone, London, United Kingdom and buried at Juna Dhobhi Ghat, Graveyard, Karachi on 09.10.2006. The petition has filed the instant SMA praying for issuance of letter of Administration in respect of estate left behind by the said deceased as mentioned in the schedule of property to the petition. The names of the legal heirs left behind by the deceased are as under:

Notice of the SMA was served on all the legal heirs of the deceased and on general public through advertisement published in the daily Express dated 24.06.2015. None appeared from any quarter to raise objection. The petitioner and legal heir, namely, Iftikhar Hussain are present in Court whereas, the legal heir, namely Pashmina Hussain, has

executed her special power of attorney in favour of petitioner having no objection for grant of letter of administration.

Two independent witnesses, namely, Tariq Hussain and Zahid Hussain are present in Court who have supported the version of the petitioner by filing their affidavit.

Since the other heirs of the deceased have no objection to the issuance of letter of administration in favour of the petitioner and the independent witnesses have also confirmed that there are no other legal heirs of the deceased except those mentioned above and none appeared from any quarter to raise objection despite publication of notice, there is no impediment in grant of this SMA. Accordingly, the same is granted and the office is directed to issue letter of administration in favour of the petitioner subject to rules.
