ORDER

Adnan-ul-Karim Memon, J. The petitioner Kamil through the instant petition under Article 199 of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973 seeks direction to initiate the recruitment process for various posts advertised by respondent No.02 in the year 2012, in which the petitioner appeared for written test for Physical Teacher (BPS-09) and secured 88 marks out of 100 marks.

- 2. We have considered the contentions advanced by learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the material available on record with their assistance.
- 3. Since the petitioner is simply seeking direction to initiate the recruitment process for appointment against the post of Physical Education Teacher (BPS-09) as per the advertisement; and, as per his claim, he became successful in the written test as well as in the interview; however, the respondents have denied the stance of the petitioner on the premise that the whole process of recruitment initiated and completed in District Sanghar through District Recruitment Committee, as such no further process for appointment is required. Because of such a statement, this petition cannot be further maintained on the aforesaid analogy so put forward by the petitioner, as he had already made a similar request to the learned Ombudsman Sindh, which was not considered on the analogy that the matter was/is sub-judice. Since much water has flowed under the

bridge and the petitioner is seeking such directions at the belated stage; prima facie, the whole recruitment process initiated in 2012 has been culminated in to its logical conclusion; therefore, no further indulgence of this Court is required in this matter to probe.

4. This petition being devoid of merit is accordingly dismissed alongwith pending applications (if any).
