1. Urgency granted.

2-4. Petitioner perhaps was an employee of the Export Processing Zones Authority. At one point of time in the year 2012 he was dismissed from service, whereafter he was reinstated in service w.e.f. 19.03.2014 vide letter dated 11.02.2019. For some claims, a writ petition was then filed in the year 2018 as C.P. No.D-6562/2018 and after contest, it was not pressed and dismissed on 27.02.2019. The petitioner is now before us again agitating that he was not paid the back benefits in between 2012 and 2014 when he remained dismissed from service.

First of all this is not a suit for recovery where plaintiff could initiate proceedings in relation to a portion of the salary/dues which were not paid. Secondly, as earlier an attempt was made for reliefs claimed in the instant petition as well as in the earlier petition which was withdrawn, hence this petition is also hit by the principle of res judicata. All triggered causes should have been made in the earlier petition as it was filed and withdrawn, hence the instant petition being misconceived is dismissed along with pending applications.
