ORDER

Zafar Ahmed Rajput, J.- Through instant petition, the petitioner seeks directions to the respondents to issue joining/posting orders.

2. It is alleged that pursuant to the publication in Daily Kawash dated 30.1.2004, the petitioner applied for the post of Junior School Teacher, which was purely on contract for three years. It is case of the petitioner that respondent No.2 on 10.7.2006 issued offer letter to petitioner which was accepted by her and after codle formalities she submitted her joining report to the respondent No.4 but when no posting order was issued, she filed this petition on 18.1.2012.

3. The respondents No.1, 2 and 3 have filed their comments wherein it has been stated that the terms of the contract have already expired in the year 2009 and the recruitment process of 2004 has already been scraped under the orders of Chief Minister, Government of Sindh for the reasons that there were a number of discrepancies in the said process. It has further been submitted that in this regard a Divisional Bench of this Court has already dismissed an identical petition bearing C.P No.D-147/2010

vide order dated 19.1.2012, copy of the said order is attached with the comments. (67)

Apparently, this petition is not maintainable before this Court for the reasons that the petitioner is not aggrieved person and even for the sake of arguments it is ~~admitted~~ ^{- Considered - 7} that she is an aggrieved person, she has not approached this Court within time as she has admittedly approached this Court after 2 ½ years of expiry of terms of the contract, which has already expired in the year 2009 and the same does not confer any right upon petitioner to maintain a constitution petition. Hence, this petition is dismissed being devoid of legal merits.
