Applicant Mst. Asiya has approached this Court seeking post-arrest bail in Crime No. 294 of 2025, registered at Police Station Rohri, District Sukkur, for an offence punishable under Section 302, P.P.C. Her earlier application for bail was declined by the learned trial Court vide order dated 27.02.2026, primarily on the ground that the final postmortem report issued by the concerned Medical Officer lends support to the prosecution's case.

It appears from the postmortem report that the deceased sustained seven injuries; however, the Medical Officer has opined that the cause of death remains uncertain. The learned trial Court while dealing with bail application has further observed that the motive behind the alleged commission of the offence has been disclosed and that no mala fide intention or ulterior motive on the part of the complainant has surfaced on record to suggest false implication of the applicant.

Mr. Abdul Hafeez Mirani, Advocate, has filed his Vakalatnama and seeks a copy of the bail application along with annexures to enable him to assist the Court on the next date of hearing.

The learned Assistant Prosecutor General is directed to assist this Court on the question as to why the present bail application should remain pending for an indefinite period when the applicant is in judicial custody, and the Medical Officer himself

has expressed uncertainty regarding the cause of death, in such circumstances, whether the applicant could be confined to jail for indefinite period in view of the medical report.

Adjourned to 08.06.2026. The Investigating Officer shall remain present on the next date of hearing along with the complete police papers.
