Mr. Rashid Raees @ B.M. advocate for petitioner.

1. Urgency granted.
3. Exemption granted subject to all just exceptions.
- 2,4&5. Petitioner prays for quashing the following FIRs:

- (i) FIR No.261/2025 under sections 147, 149, 504, 337-A (i), F (i) PPC; and
- (ii) FIR No.66/2026 under sections 447, 511, 452, 147, 149, 504, 506, 337-A (i), F (i) PPC.

Both FIRs registered at PS B-Section Latifabad Hyderabad.

As regards FIR No.261/2025, admittedly a challan has been filed before the concerned Magistrate. As regards FIR No.66/2026, learned counsel submits that the same is still under investigation.

Regards FIR No.261/2025, learned counsel is queried whether the petitioner availed the alternate remedy available before the Magistrate for premature acquittal under section 249-A Cr.P.C. He concedes that the petitioner did not. The petition does not bring forth any exceptional circumstances to by-pass said remedy in the exercise of constitutional jurisdiction. With regard to FIR No.66/2026, learned counsel has not been able to convince us to intervene in the on-going investigation of the case.

Suffice to say that once investigation is complete, the petitioner will have a remedy before the trial Court under section 249-A or 265-K Cr.P.C., as the case may be.

For the foregoing reasons, the petition is **dismissed** along with listed applications.
